THE „BORDERS OF HEALTH“ IN PRESENT AND FUTURE

In June 2017, BAYHOST, in with the Institute of cooperation Deggendorf Technology organises an Alumni Academy that is sponsored by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). The Alumni Academy is not only aimed at DIT and BAYHOST alumni but at all students from Eastern Europe who studied at a Bavarian university for at least three months. Students from all fields of study can apply.

The Academy takes place in Deggendorf from **21 to 25 June 2017**. It is held in German and you can apply **until 26 March 2017**.

Health is a topic that is relevant for everyone, whether in your family, at work or with friends and colleagues. The 5-day Alumni Academy by BAYHOST and DIT deals with the „borders“ of health for people and society as a whole in science and in everyday life.

The „borders“ of health are currently being redefined by new challenges at the workplace, by population shift, by modern science, by future-oriented health management. The latter, together with cross-border medical services, are among publically little known topics, although there is substantial scientific, political and economic integration potential.

The Academy provides further education for alumni in three fields:

- ▶ Work-Life-Balance
- ▶ Health management in organisations
- ▶ cross-border services

Participants will be taught to stay healthy themselves and to take that knowledge into their workplace and share it with co-workers. Further education and additional trainings are to show up new professional and private perspectives.

▶ MASTER INTERNATIONAL TOURISM MANAGEMENT

On the European Campus in Pfarrkirchen, the course M.A. International Tourism Management is offered as of Sommersemester 2017

▶ INTERNATIONAL DUAL STUDY PROGRAMME CO-OP BETWEEN BAVARIA AND THE CZECH REPUBLIC

Together with the University of West Bohemia Pilsen and the Institute of Technology and Business Budweis, DIT won the acceptance for a Bavarian-Czech INTER-REG project. The project objective is to establish a dual study programme in the border region of Bavaria and the Czech Republic.

Dual study programmes are well established in Bavaria and respected by students and businesses alike; however, there is no similar concept in the Czech republic. With the partner programme, students at the three partner Universities can now study in an international dual study programme together with

companies situated in Bavaria and the Czech Republic.

The project starts with the Deggendorf-based MAX STREICHER GmbH & Co. KG aA and Plattling-based Kermi GmbH. Both companies can look back on year-long experience with dual students.

After the also successfully launched „C.A.S.T.“ programme in China (see PG edition 21), this is the second project initiated by the DIT Career Service promising long-term perspectives against the lack of qualified staff and for more international orientation.

Not only will the project promote the border region of Lower Bavaria and the Czech republic as an attractive location for industry, the networking of the universities and prospective employers is also strengthened.

Companies introduce themselves

▶ ALUMNI TALK - CLAUDIA KUTTENHOFER

Five years ago, Claudia Kuttenhofer graduated in Tourism Management at DIT. Now she is the head of business communications at the owner-managed company Sano. In this interview she will tell us how this came about.

How did you transition from tourism management into agriculture?

Apart from farm holidays, the link between agriculture and tourism is not easy to see right away. Yet, my career lead me to it. After DIT and an orientational internship, my direction was set: communication. I didn't care what industry, whether it was tourism or agriculture. Admittedly, I hadn't had any contact with agriculture, it is considered conservative and rusty but that's exactly where I see the fascination.

Why did you opt for Sano?

The job description immediately caught my eye. It contained all the tasks I wanted to do after studying. At Sano, I can choose my tasks according to my talents and wishes. Another aspect was the Sano academy that offers professional and personal opportunities. I worked my way up from assistant to head of marketing, sales promotion and now company communication.



What are some of your tasks?

In classic marketing, strategic marketing planning, the responsibility over several projects as well as editing our customer magazine are some of my core tasks. Since early 2017, I have been building up the Sano company communication department. This is a reaction to growing requirements for a professional public image on the market.

What do you personally like the most about Sano?

The possibilities for development, the small steps in the hierarchy and the short decision ways, my workplace with a view over a green area, the freedom and room for creativity, the preparedness for change at Sano and the international environment.

When to apply at Sano?

Our slogan is: „Your direction, your decision!“ is the particularity with Sano. We would like to show every individual mem-

ber of staff, throughout their careers, what possibilities they have for career and life changes within the company. If you would like to take on more responsibility, and make a change in a future-oriented industry in a modern company, you're right at Sano. As we are not always about filling a certain position. We are more and more looking for people who fit into the team and vice versa. Quite often, the right positions evolved from a job interview.
